Between 2018 and 2022, the number of individuals experiencing homelessness in Lethbridge has doubled from 223 people to 454 people.

Rent Supplement

The LHA wait list is long, however it should be part of the first steps when facing evictions and homelessness.

- Community Housing Based on 30% of household income
- Affordable Housing Rented at 10-50% below current market rental rates.
- Rent Supplement Assists households in need to obtain affordable and suitable rental housing accommodations by subsidizing rent in the private sector.

But it will make things harder.

If accepted, you will be assigned to a Housing

If assigned a case manager, they will explain the next steps.



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

DIVERSION

Diversion/Eviction Prevention if an eviction can be saved by diversion funding- an application is made to Lethbridge Housing Authority.

CART Process

Setting housing goals

Working towards keeping episodes of homelessness brief and most importantly, non-recurring.

STEP 1

Unhoused but ready for engagement and working towards housing





STEP 3

CART Meeting- Case is presented and a referral to a program is made.



STEP 4

If a program match is made, Participants work with their case managers to complete Service Plans.

STEP 5

Reach the final goal of a stabilized and supported individual who is housed appropriately for their needs.





Community Partner completes assessment with the individual- determines possibility of Diversion/Eviction Prevention

Progress Over Perfection

Why a CART referral?

- Reviewed by all CART members
- Discussion is interagency
- Additional sources of outbound referrals
- Weekly meetings
- Defined roles and definitions of service
- Increased cooperation and accountability
- Decrease in duplication of services
- Better cohesion and understanding of system (and it's gaps)

What is CART Housing Case Management?

Housing Case Managers help people who have been experiencing homelessness or are at risk of eviction find and keep stable housing.

Case Managers provide support and guidance to help individuals and families overcome obstacles that may be preventing them from securing and maintaining a home.

We are a recovery focused program and work closely with multiple outside agencies, like Recovery Alberta (formerly AHS Addiction and Mental Health) to provide the best supports for long term housing success.

Important Note

CART does not have a hidden supply of housing units or funding.

Our goal is to assist and support in navigating the housing system and overcoming barriers to stable housing. We are here to help referrals stabilize and stay housed.

The availability of housing will depend on various external factors and suitability.
